African Swine Fever means that almost 100,000 pigs were culled in 2024

As can be seen in the table above, Italy was severely hit by African Swine Fever in 2024.

According to Pig Progress, almost 100,000 domestic pigs have been culled in Italy this year in a battle to control African Swine Fever in the country.

The majority of pigs came from Italy's largest pig producing region, Lombardy, where 74,882 pigs have been culled.

Lombardy, which accounts for up to half of Italy's total pig population of 10 million pigs, was hit hard by the disease this year, with 22 pig farms affected by the disease.

In another northern Italian region, Piedmont, 23,626 pigs at eight pig farms have been culled this year as part of the battle against African Swine Fever.



Pig population - 1 October 2024

Last week, Statistics Denmark published the results of the pig census conducted on 1 October 2024. The results are published in the table below.

Compared to one year ago, the 1 October census sows a 3.7 per cent rise in the total pig population.

The rise is accounted for by the categories, Piglets with sows, Weaned sows < 50 kg and Finishers >50 kg. Compared to the census one year ago, there is therefore a modest rise in both piglets and finishers.

The breeding herd in the form of pregnant sows increased by 2.3 per cent compared to one year ago but is largely unchanged compared to the 1 July census.

The fact that the breeding herd has stabilised and is starting to show signs of a slight rise compared to one year ago is due to high piglet prices and the strong improvement in profitability for piglet producers since the turn of the year 2022/2023.

Authorities declare Taiwan free from African Swine Fever

Pig333 reports that the World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH) has stated that the authorities in Taiwan have declared the country free from African Swine Fever.

To date, the Taiwanese authorities have not published any cases of African Swine Fever among wild boar or at pig farms in the country. However, in 2022 and the years before, African Swine Fever was found in smuggled pork and in carcases that had washed up on Taiwan's coastline.

Taiwan's pig population totals 5.3 million pigs distributed across 5,800 pig farms. There is also a limited wild boar population in the mountainous regions of the country.



Large majority in California reject proposal to ban intensive livestock production

U.S. media reports that an 85 per cent majority in a referendum in Sonoma County in California have said no to a controversial proposal to ban intensive livestock production, including intensive pig production.

In Denver, a proposal to ban meat plants within city limits was also rejected in a referendum.

It is a tradition in the U.S. for a series of referendums in various states to be held in connection with presidential and congressional elections.



Tõnnies to change its name to Premium Food Group in 2025

Tönnies Group has announced that the group will change its name to Premium Food Group in 2025.

The purpose is to convey that the company is not just a slaughtering and meat company, but a company that produces and sells a range of different food products.

The name Tönnies, however, will continue to be used for sales of the group's meat and sausage products.



Rise in Russian pig meat production expected to slow in 2025

According to Pig Progress, which quotes the Russian National Union of Pork Producers (RUPP), Russian pig production will rise by 3.3 per cent in 2024 and 1.2 per cent in 2025.

This year, production is expected to reach 6.2 tonnes live weight. Production continues to rise for large integrated pig farms, which account for more than 90 per cent of production, whereas individual and so-called backyard farms are seeing a continued decline in production.

As Russian pig meat consumption has been increasing for a number of years, and the domestic market is on the verge of saturation, RUPP believes that future production growth will go for export.

According to Pig333, figures from the Russian authorities show that in the first nine months of 2024, Russia exported around 200,000 tonnes of pig meat. The largest export market is Belarus with 65,000 tonnes, followed by Vietnam and China with 59,000 tonnes and 30,000 tonnes respectively.

According to official data, around 50 per cent of exports are frozen pig meat, 23 per cent are fresh/chilled pig meat and 27 per cent are by-products.



Rise in Canada's pig meat exports this year – largely back to 2022 levels

With Canada's export statistics as the source, the tables below show Canada's exports of fresh/frozen pig meat and by-products by country for January-September 2024 compared to the same period in 2023 and 2022.

As is shown by the figures, Canada's exports of fresh/frozen pig meat increased in 2024 and have largely returned to 2022 levels.

There has been a decline in exports of fresh/frozen pig meat to China, but this is more than offset by rising exports to a number of other markets. As opposed to the EU and the U.S., Canada also saw a strong rise in exports to Japan in 2024.

As regards by-products, there has been a modest rise in Canadian exports to the largest market, China.

Rise in U.S. pig meat exports this year

With U.S. export statistics as the source, the following tables show U.S. exports of fresh/frozen pig meat and by-products by country for January-September 2024 compared to the same period in 2023 and 2022.

Exports of fresh/frozen pig meat for January-September 2024 are 5.1 per cent higher than the same period last year, while exports of by-products saw a marginal rise of 1.0 per cent. In 2023, U.S. exports rose compared to the previous year.

As regards fresh/frozen pig meat, the rise in exports to Mexico, the largest export market for U.S. pig meat, continue. South Korea, Columbia and Australia have also seen rises in U.S. exports of fresh/frozen pig meat. By contrast, there was a sharp decline in exports to China and a slight decline in exports to Japan. As regards Canada, exports have fallen this year following a strong rise in 2023.

As regards by-products, there was a decline in exports to China. However, this was offset by rises to Mexico, Philippines and a number of other markets.
