### Sharp fall in pig production in the wake of African Swine Fever

Pig Progress reports that the Ukrainian Meat Association (UMA) has warned that Ukraine's pig meat production is facing a sharp decline as a result of African Swine Fever.

According to the UMA, many pigs have been traded illegally, which has resulted in a serious and uncontrolled spread of the virus. They are calling for a vaccination programme to begin.

The Ukrainian Pig Breeders Association, however, is against the use of vaccines as long as international veterinary organisations continue not to recognise vaccines as effective in the battle against African Swine Fever.



### Expected production, consumption and trade in pig meat in 2025

The USDA has just published its quarterly report containing its outlook for the global production, consumption and trade in pig meat for 2024 and 2025.

The figures cover a number of countries, with the figures stated in tonnes/carcase weight. Trade only covers fresh/frozen pig meat, which means the substantial imports of by-products are not included in the import/export figures.

#### Pig meat production

For all selected countries, the USDA expects an unchanged pig meat production in 2024 to be replaced by a slight fall in production in 2025.

The slightly lower production in 2025 is the result of an expected 2 per cent decline in production for China and EU. This more than offsets an expected rise in production for a number of countries such as the U.S., Brazil, Vietnam, Canada and Mexico.

The projected 2 per cent fall in pig meat production in China is due to the decline in the sow population and the fact that demand for pig meat in the Chinese market is under pressure as a result of rising economic uncertainty and the growing demand for poultry.

The projected 2 per cent fall in the EU's pig meat production in 2025 is explained by the expected lower pig prices in the EU.

The rise in U.S. pig meat production in both 2024 and 2025 is in part due to increased productivity in the U.S. breeding population and in part to an increase in carcase weight. The increase in carcase weight is due to improved earnings in U.S. pig production and lower feed prices.

#### Trade in pig meat

USDA does not anticipate any major changes to the global trade in pig meat in 2025.

The U.S. and Canada are expected to see a modest rise in exports in 2025, which will more than offset the expected slight fall in the EU's pig meat exports in 2025.

The slight decline in exports from the EU in 2025 is due to a downturn in EU production, which means that there will be less pig meat available for exports. African Swine Fever will also continue to be an impediment to exports from the EU.

USDA expects U.S. pig meat exports to rise by 3 per cent in 2025. Despite greater competition from Brazil, Mexico is expected to remain the main market for U.S. pig meat exports. The USDA also expects U.S. pig meat to be competitive in export markets and to win market shares from the EU in South Korea and Australia.

### EU Commission expects pig meat production in 2025 to remain stable

The EU Commission recently published its latest short-term outlook for EU agricultural markets with preliminary estimates for 2024 and the outlook for 2025.

The table below shows the EU Commission's expectations for changes in the EU's production, export and consumption of pig meat in 2024 and 2025 compared to previous years.

As is shown, the Commission expects that the sharp fall in EU production of pig meat in 2023 (-6.5 per cent) to be replaced by stable production in 2024 and 2025.

This slightly contradicts the most recent outlook from the USDA which expects a slight rise of 2 per cent in the EU's pig meat production in 2024 and a corresponding fall in production in 2025.

As regards beef, the EU Commission expects a slight fall in production of 1.0 per cent in 2025. This follows a slight fall of 0.5 per cent in 2024 and a more significant fall in 2023 of 3.9 per cent.

As regards poultry, the EU Commission expects a slight rise of 0.9 per cent in EU production in 2025. This follows some major rises in production in the previous years of 4.0 per cent in 2024 and 2.5 per cent in 2023.



CHINA

### Fall in pig slaughtering

Reuters reports that figures from the Chinese authorities state that Chinese pig slaughtering for the first three quarters of 2024 stood at 520.3 million head, down 3.2 per cent from a year earlier. Measured in tonnes, slaughtering amounted to 42.4 million tonnes, a fall of 1.4 per cent compared to last year.

The fall in slaughtering is in line with the latest figures for the Chinese pig herd, which stood at 426.94 million head at the end of September, a fall of 3.5 per cent compared to last year.

Following an extended period of losses in 2022 and 2023, Chinese pig producers have turned in a profit since March, with their best performance in Q3 2024. Pig prices peaked in September at almost 21 yuan per kg. According to Reuters, however, the price has since fallen and is now slightly over 17 yuan per kg.

### **Tönnies opens new slaughterhouse in China**

According to the German Topagrar, Tönnies opened a new slaughterhouse in Sichuan province in China this month.

The new slaughterhouse is a joint venture with its Chinese partners, Dekon.

In 2020, Tönnies and Dekon entered an agreement to invest around EUR 500 million in a new slaughterhouse in China. At that time, it was announced that the new slaughterhouse would have a capacity for 2 million pigs per year, with the goal of eventually increasing the number of slaughtering to seven million.



**UK**

### **Increase in slaughtering numbers**

Figures from the trade organisation, AHDB, show that UK finisher slaughtering for the first three quarters of 2024 stood at 7.63 million head. This is a rise of 2.0 per cent compared to the same period last year. A rise in carcase weight means that, in tonnage, the rise is 3.4 per cent.

AHDB's outlook forecasts slaughtering in 2024 to total 10.2 million head, a rise of 1.5 per cent compared to last year.

Measured in tonnes, AHDB expects slaughtering to end at around 951,000 tons in 2024 – a rise of 2.7 per cent compared to last year.



**CANADA**

### **Maple Leaf announces name for new company - Canada Packers**

Maple Leaf has announced the name of its new production company, Canada Packers.

From 2025, the Canadian Maple Leaf will be split into two listed companies: a new production company, known as Canada Packers and Maple Leaf Foods.

Canada Packers will be responsible for 85,000 sows and two slaughterhouses, the largest in Brandon, Manitoba and another in Lethbridge, Alberta.

Last year, the two slaughterhouses killed 4 million pigs, but have a capacity for 5 million pigs.

Maple Leaf will retain 19.9 per cent ownership of Canada Packers, with the two companies agreeing to supply pig meat to Maple Leaf Foods. It was previously announced that sales would be broken down into about 1/3 to Maple Leaf Foods, 1/3 to current export markets and 1/3 to retail fresh pork in Canada and the US.

In future, Maple Leaf Foods will be responsible for the sale of processed meat, including brands such as Schneiders. The company will also continue to sell poultry and plant protein products.



**SOUTH KOREA**

### **Increasing imports of pig meat to South Korea in 2024 – but fall in imports from many EU countries**

The table below shows the official figures for South Korea's imports of fresh/frozen pig meat for January-September 2024 compared to the same period in 2023 and 2022.

As can be seen, South Korea's total imports of fresh/frozen pig meat in the first nine months of 2024 were higher than the same period in the previous two years.

In 2024, South Korea imported increased quantities of pig meat from the U.S., Canada, Chile and Brazil. However, imports from the major exporting EU countries such as Spain, Holland and Denmark have declined.

In 2024, South Korea resumed exports of pig meat from Germany following an almost three-year hiatus because of African Swine Fever. In 2022, South Korea resumed imports of pig meat from Belgium after the country was declared free from African Swine Fever.

## BRAZIL

### Rise in pig meat exports

The table below shows the official figures for Brazil's exports of fresh/frozen pig meat for January-September 2024 compared to the same period in the previous two years.

As can be seen, Brazil's total pig meat exports are 5.3 per cent up on the same period last year and compared to two years ago, exports rose by 15.5 per cent. The rise in exports this year compared to last came in the third quarter, as exports in the first half year were largely at the level of the previous year.

This year has seen a sharp fall in exports to China and Hong Kong. However, this is more than offset by a rise in exports to a number of other export markets for Brazilian pig meat.

Mexico and the Dominican Republic are new markets, which have opened up to Brazilian pig meat in recent years. The U.S. is a large pig meat exporter to these two countries.

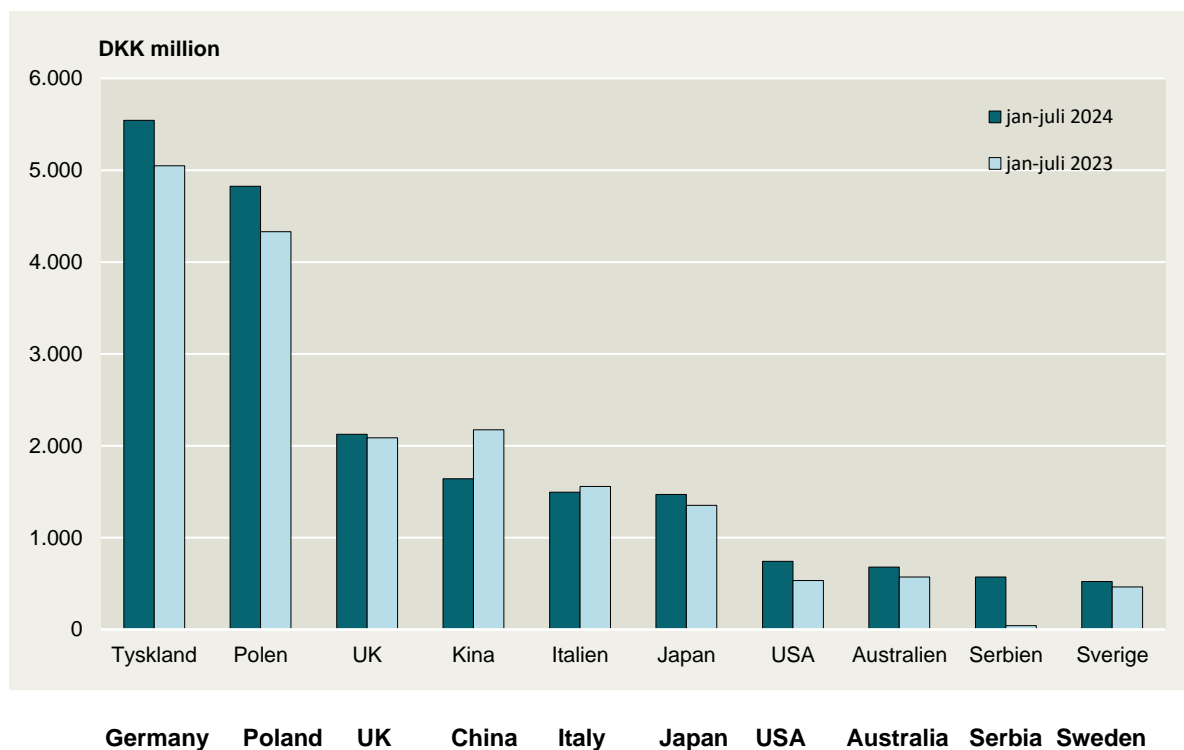

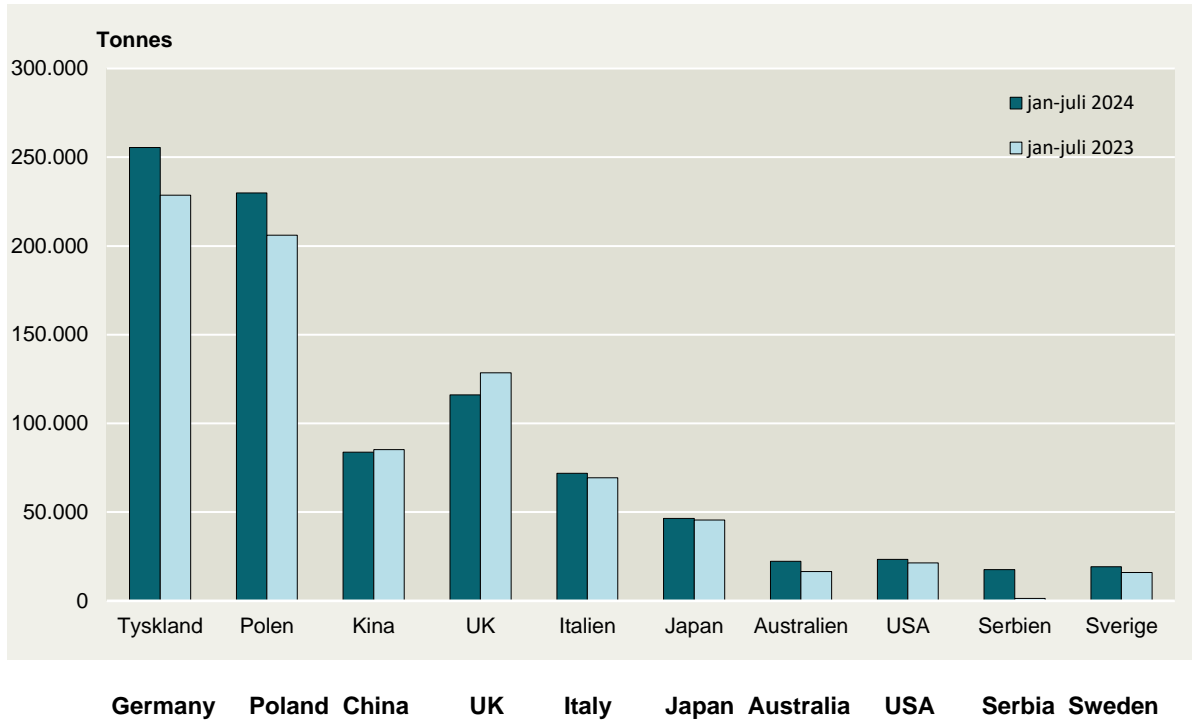
