Pig producers deny major impact from African Swine Fever

Pig Progress reports that the Ukrainian Pig Farmers Association (UPA) denies that Ukraine's pig meat production is facing a serious decline as a result of African Swine Fever.

Previously, the Ukrainian Meat Association (UMA) warned that Ukraine's pig meat production was facing a serious decline because of ASF outbreaks and called on the authorities to begin a vaccination programme (Market News week 43).

According to the Ukrainian Pig Farmers Association (UPA), statements from the UMA are exaggerated and can be manipulative in nature. The producers' association recognises that there are problems, and that the spread of the disease is, in many cases, facilitated by farms where basic veterinary rules are not followed.

However, according to UPA, the number of outbreaks is not record-breaking and that since the beginning of 2024, Ukraine has had 67 outbreaks. At the peak of the disease in 2017, the country registered 166 outbreaks.

Whereas the UMA is in favour of starting to vaccinate against African Swine Fever, the UPA is against it. The UPA points out that so far, no international veterinary organisation has recognised the vaccines as effective in controlling the disease.



Rabobank: pig meat production expected to fall by 0.5 per cent in EU by 2025

According to German agriculture media, Rabobank expects EU pig meat production to fall by 0.5 per cent in 2025.

The decline in the EU will mainly be driven by the expected sharp fall of 10-15 per cent in Holland's pig production in 2025. The reason for this is Holland's buy-up schemes for livestock producers that are expected to have a strongly negative impact on Dutch production in 2025.

Rabobank expects that the smaller supply of pig meat may mean increasing pig meat prices in the EU market in 2025.

Rabobank's forecast is close to the EU Commission's latest short-term outlook for EU agricultural markets, which expects a 0.2 per cent fall in the EU's pig meat production in 2025.



Agreement may increase exports to China

Pig 333 reports that the authorities in Belgium and China have entered into an agreement that may increase pig meat exports to China.

The agreement includes pigs' trotters that are not widely consumed in Belgium but are popular in China.

Following an outbreak of African Swine Fever in 2018, Belgium resumed access to the Chinese market again in early 2024. In the first three quarters of 2024, therefore, China imported 1,100 tonnes of fresh/frozen pig meat and 7,600 tonnes of by-products from Belgium.

It is this agreement that is now being expanded to include pigs' trotters and other products.



WH Group seeks shareholder approval for U.S. listing of Smithfield Foods

According to international media, the Chinese WH Group will hold an extraordinary general meeting on 6 December where they will seek to get shareholders' approval for WH Group's subsidiary, Smithfield Foods, to be listed on the New York Stock Exchange.

In July, WH Group announced that it was planning an upcoming listing of Smithfield Foods either on the New York Stock Exchange or Nasdaq.



Rusagro acquires pig production business

Last week, Russia's largest agricultural company, Rusagro Group, announced that they have acquired 100 per cent ownership of the Russian company, LLC Agro-Belogorie.

In 2019, Rusagro acquired 22.5 per cent of the shares in LLC Agro-Belogorie. This was increased to 47.5 per cent at the beginning of the autumn this year.

The acquisition includes 20 pig farms, three feed mills, a slaughterhouse and a bank in Belgorod. According to the announcement from Rusagro, the acquisition makes the company Russia's second largest pig producer.

SERBIA

Increasing pig meat imports in 2024

Serbia's pig meat imports in 2024 rose as the country's pig production declined due to extensive outbreaks of African Swine Fever.

The table below shows Serbia's imports of fresh/frozen pig meat by country for January-September 2024 compared to the same period in the previous two years.

Spain remains the largest exporter of pig meat to Serbia while Serbia's imports of pig meat from Russia are rising sharply. They are now not far from the import figures for Spain.

The rise in pig meat imports to Serbia should be seen against the background of a strong decline in the Serbian pig population due to African Swine Fever.

Serbia has battled against ASF since the disease was first reported in the country in 2019. As is shown in the table on page 2, in 2023, Serbia saw a strong increase in the number of outbreaks of ASF in the country's pig herds.

December 2023's pig census posted a 20 per cent decline in the country's pig population compared with the previous year. The latest census from May/June 2024 puts the country's pig population as being 4 per cent lower than this time last year.

Increasing imports from North America

The table below shows Australia's imports of fresh/frozen pig meat by country for the first three quarters of 2024 compared to the same period in 2023 and 2022.

As can be seen from the figures, Australian imports this year increased compared to last, but are down on 2022.

There was a strong rise in Australian imports of pig meat from the U.S. and Canada but imports from EU countries, such as Holland and Ireland, fell.

NEW ZEALAND

Stable imports of pig meat

New Zealand's pig meat imports for the first three quarters of 2024 are stable compared to the same period in the previous two years.

The table below shows New Zealand's imports of fresh/frozen pig meat by country for January-September 2024 compared to the same period in the previous two years.

As can be seen from the figures, this year has seen an increase in imports from Canada and the U.S. From EU countries, the picture is slightly more mixed, with falls in imports from Spain and Holland whereas imports from Germany and Denmark increased this year.

Imports of pig meat in 2024 are unchanged

The table below shows Malaysia's imports of fresh/frozen pig meat by country for January-September 2024 compared to the same period in the previous two years.

As can be seen from the figures, this year pig meat imports have largely remained unchanged following a sharp rise in 2023. There have been declines in imports from Spain, Denmark and other EU countries. By contrast, imports from Canada and the U.S. have increased.

In 2023 (under Others), Malaysia also imported pig meat from countries such as Thailand, India, Singapore, Vietnam, Italy and Germany.
