Authorities in Hessen offer reward for culling wild boar in the buffer zone

In an effort to control African Swine Fever, the authorities in Hessen are offering a EUR 100 reward for each wild boar shot within the buffer zone.

The payment is being offered to hunters authorised to hunt there.

According to ISN in Germany, 124 cases of African Swine Fever had been found in Hessen by 26 August: 117 in the Gros-Gerau district, two in the Bergstrasse district and five in the Darmstadt-Dieburg district.

The latter district has now established a buffer zone where the payment is being offered.



New outbreaks of African Swine Fever at pig farms in Lombardy

As in Germany, Italy was hit by new outbreaks of African Swine Fever this summer. In addition to wild boar, the virus has also been reported at a number of Italian pig farms.

Pig Progress reports that by 30 August, 23 farms had been affected in northern Italy.

Outbreaks have been particularly prevalent in Italy's largest pig producing region, Lombardy.



Smithfield spins off its European operations to focus on its American business

Smithfield announced last week that it is separating its European operations to focus on plans to list in the United States.

Smithfield runs a number of operations in Europe, which will either continue under the WH Group or perhaps be sold off, as some American media have speculated. The European operations cover a number of companies in Poland, Romania, the UK, Slovakia, Hungary and Spain.

The decision to separate its European operations from the rest of Smithfield should, according to the company, be seen as part of a new strategy to streamline operations and focus on Smithfield's efforts in the core market of North America where they want to continue to grow within packaged meats.

In 2013, Smithfield Foods was acquired by the Chinese WH Group for USD 4.7 billion. WH Group is the world's largest pork company with leading positions in China, the U.S. and Europe.



Pig producers posted earnings of USD 15 per pig in July

Calculations from Iowa State University show that American pig producers (farrow to finish) posted average earnings of USD 15 dollars per pig in July.

This is unchanged from June and is the fourth month in a row for the model calculation to show a profit for US pig producers.

Earnings since April have fluctuated between USD 12 and USD 17 dollars per pig and follow an extended period of losses. According to the calculations from Iowa State University, pig producers posted losses of USD 31 per pig in 2023.

The recent improvement is a consequence of rising settlement prices and falling feed prices.



Unions to challenge government intervention in court

Last week, the Canadian government intervened to prevent a strike among Canadian rail workers.

The union representing the rail workers has now filed court challenges against the country's industrial labour board. They believe that the intervention erodes the workers' bargaining power.

There has so far been no reaction from either the rail company or the labour minister to the union's decision.

Spain's Prime Minister to meet China's President Xi Jinping next week

During a visit to China, the Spanish Prime Minister, Pedro Sanchez, will meet China's President Xi Jinping.

The visit will take place against the backdrop of an escalating trade dispute: China has threatened to impose additional tariffs on European pig meat in retaliation for European tariffs on Chinese electric vehicles.



Rusagro expects to export up to 10,000 tonnes of pig meat to China this year

Pig333 reports that the large agricultural holding company, Rusagro, stated at an investor meeting that they expect to export up to 10,000 tonnes of pig meat to China. The company will also export feed to China.

The Russian Union of Pork Producers (RUPP) previously stated that Russia's exports to China were expected to total between 30,000 and 35,000 tonnes pig meat.

In March, the first three Russian companies were approved for the export of pig meat to China. One of the three companies was Tambovsky Bacon, which is a part of Rusagro.

PANAMA

Panama opens its market to pig meat and poultry from Brazil

The Pig Site reports that the authorities in Panama have announced the opening of its market to imports of pig meat and poultry from Brazil.

The decision has, of course, been welcomed by the Brazilian Animal Protein Association (ABPA).

Panama has a population of 4.4 million and is a popular tourist destination.

According to USDA, the country imported 15,500 tonnes of chicken and 17,000 tonnes of pig meat in 2023 mainly from North America.
